NOTICE OF RACE AND SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020.
- 1.2 The CYA prescriptions will apply.
- 1.3 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The race is open to all keelboats that hold a current PHRF certificate.
- 2.2 All boats will race in a single class.
- 2.3 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online registration @ kelownayachtclub.com or at skippers meeting at Tree Beer Institute before 1700 August 17, 2017.

3 FEES

- 3.1 Jack & Jill Race- no entry fee

4 SCHEDULE

- Date of racing: Aug 17, 2017.
- The scheduled time of the warning signal is 1800.

5 MEASUREMENTS

- Each boat shall produce a valid PHRF rating certificate.

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- Jack & Jill race crew must consist of one male and one female.
- All boats shall declare to RC before race whether they are FS or NFS.
- NFS will receive +15 on PHRF rating.
- Scoring will be PHRF TOT.
- Course will be posted on RC prior to the warning signal.
- There will be one start. Time Limit is 90 minutes.



All boats not finished within the time limit will be scored DNF.

Any boats retiring or withdrawing will notify RC.

Boats failing to do so will be scored DSQ.

7 VENUE

Regatta headquarters will be at Kelowna Yacht Club and the racing will be held in the waters of Okanagan Lake, off the city waterfront.

8 THE COURSES

9 PROTESTS

9.1 Protests will only be heard upon presentation of a 40 oz. bottle of Rum prior to hearing.

9.2 Decisions of the protest committee will be final as provided in rule 70.5.

10 SCORING

10.1 The Low Point System will apply.

11 BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places in the Kelowna Yacht Club basin.

12 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Keelboat haul out restrictions if applicable will be defined in the SI's.

13 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats.

This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

14 PRIZES

First, second and third place overall prizes will be awarded at conclusion of race.

15 SAFETY



16 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

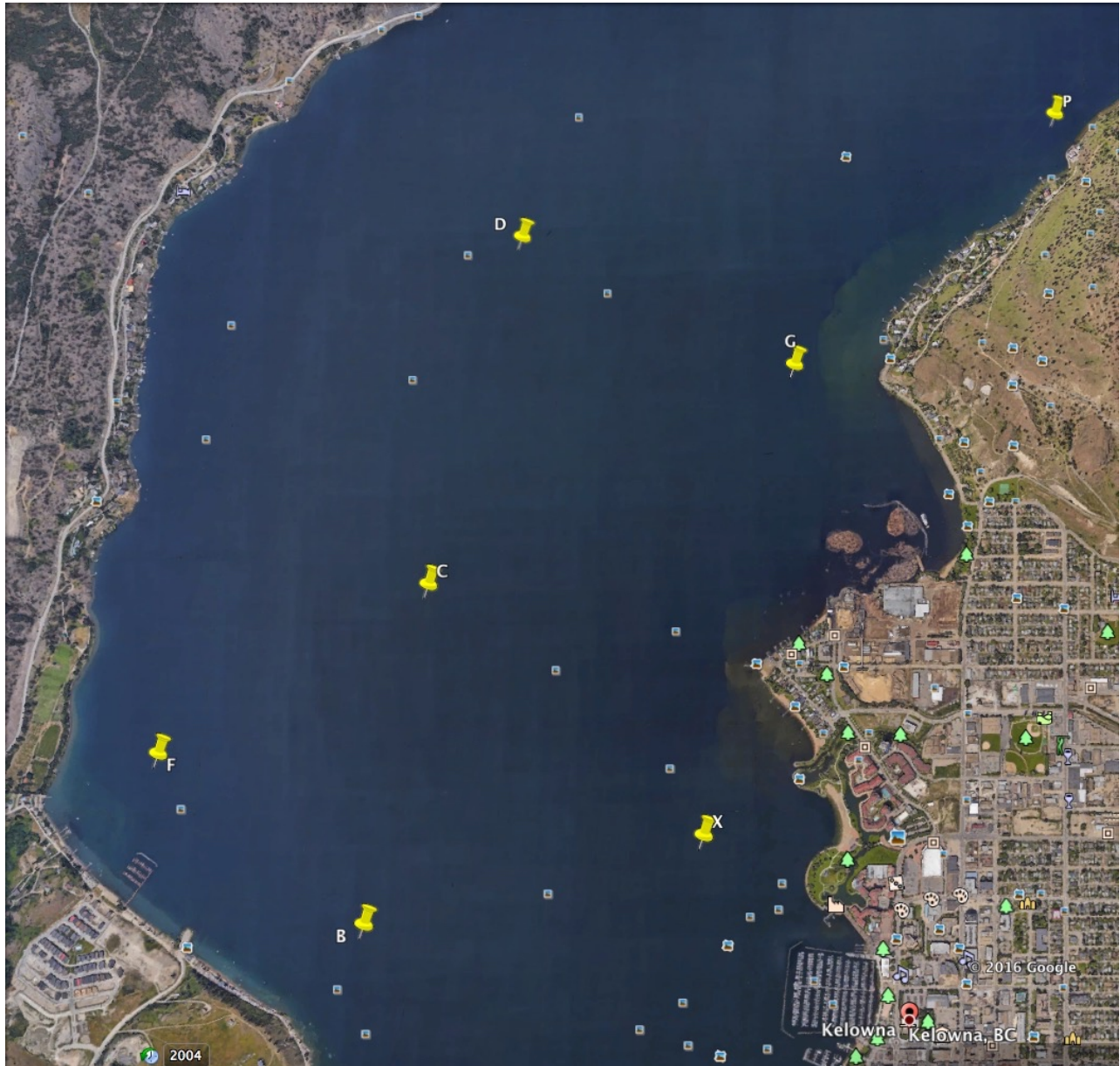
17 INSURANCE
