## NOTICE OF RACE (NoR)

### 1.0 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (2021-2024), the prescriptions of Sail Canada, this Notice of Race, and The Sailing Instructions (SIs) for this series.
- 1.2 The KYC Covid 19 Updates and Safety Information found on the KYC website [kelownayachtclub.com/news/](http://kelownayachtclub.com/news/) applies.

### 2.0 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available after 12:00 PM (noon) on or before April 1, 2022, at [kelownayachtclub.com/racing/womens-sailing/](http://kelownayachtclub.com/racing/womens-sailing/).

### 3.0 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The KYC Flag pole and on-dock bulletin board, located south of the ramp to the main dock. NoR and SIs updates will also be posted at [kelownayachtclub.com/racing/womens-sailing/](http://kelownayachtclub.com/racing/womens-sailing/).
- 3.2 [Discretionary Penalty - DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on Channel 72.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio, channel 72.
- 3.4 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

### 4.0 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to all keel boats with female only crew (male coaches are permitted). All boats must be able to show a certificate of public liability insurance, as outlined in Section 13. All boats without a valid PHRF certificate will have a PHRF assigned by the race chair and fleet handicapper.
- 4.2 Crew who are on a designated boat may enter the event by registering online at [kelownayachtclub.com/racing/womens-sailing/](http://kelownayachtclub.com/racing/womens-sailing/) . Boats will need to submit their completed registration and COVID forms before entering. Registration will include a waiver form.
- 4.3 All boats will be handicapped using the Time on Time PHRF system.

4.4 Classes are defined as follows:

Fleet 1	PHRF	Women Only
Fleet 2	PHRF	Women plus coaches

4.5 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements including submitting COVID and waivers form and pay all fees.

## 5.0 FEES

5.1 All Crew member as well as coaches must register. Entry fees for all Classes are as follows:

6.0 **SCHEDULE** 6:00 PM Local time on Monday evenings. See Addendum C for dates.

## 7.0 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

7.1 Boats may be inspected at any time.

7.2 The following equipment must be on board at all times and may be inspected at anytime. Safety equipment as per Transport Canada (see Addendum B)

## 8.0 VENUE

8.1 The venue will be at and around the Kelowna Yacht Club located at 1370 Water St., Kelowna, BC.

8.2 NoR Addendum A shows the location of the racing areas.

## 9.0 COURSES

9.1 The course will be around permanent KYC marks A, B, C, D, and E. All turning marks are to be left to port. The start and finish line will be comprised of the Race Committee boat and Mark X.

## 10.0 SCORING

10.1

- a) When fewer than four races have been completed in a series a boat's score for that series shall be the total of her race scores within that series.
- b) When four or more races have been completed in a series a boat's score for the series shall be the total of her race scores within that series excluding her worse score.
- c) One or more completed races will constitute a series.

10.2 Rules A5.3 applies.

## **11.0 RISK STATEMENT**

11.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform, and fatigue resulting in an increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.

11.2 The organizing authority, management, Board of Directors and volunteers, will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after this race series.

## **12.0 INSURANCE**

12.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$2,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

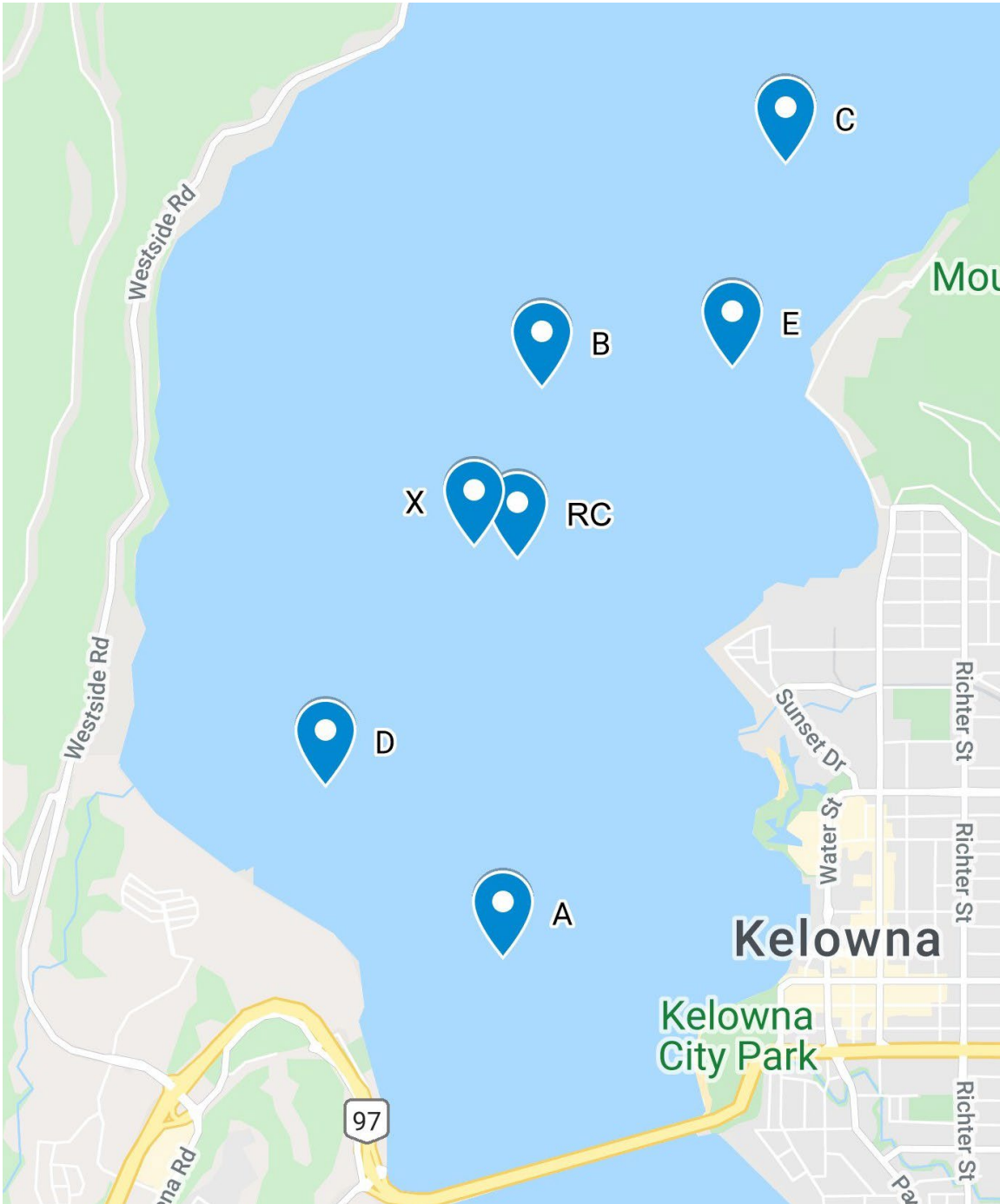
## **13.0 PRIZES**
