

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

ORGANIZING AUTHORITY: Kelowna Yacht Club

DATES: July 21-23, 2023

[DP] denotes a rule for which a penalty is at the discretion of the protest committee.

[NP] denotes that a breach of this rule will not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes Rule 60.1(a)

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)
- 1.2 The prescriptions of Sail Canada will apply.
- 1.3 The Santana 525 class rules will apply. They are available at <u>kelownayachtclub.com/racing/open-racing/</u>
- 1.4 Safety protocols may be in place for the duration of the event in accordance with the Kelowna Yacht Club Safety Plan which can be located at <u>kelownayachtclub.com/news/club-safety-information/</u>
- 1.5 If there is a conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions shall take precedence.

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 09:00 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 20:00 on the day before it will take effect.

3. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located on the Commodore's Dock.
- 3.2 The race office is located in the Grand Banquet Room.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee intends to monitor and communicate with competitors on VHF radio channel 72.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the Regatta Flagpole situated on the Western edge of the Commodore's Dock.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in Race Signals AP.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 There will be a competitor's meeting at the Commodore's Dock at 09:00 on Saturday, July 22, 2023.
- 5.2 The scheduled time for the first warning signal, Saturday, July 22 is 10:00 with no race starting later than 16:00.
- 5.3 The scheduled time for the first warning signal, Sunday, July 23 is 09:30 with no race starting later than 14:30.

6. CLASS FLAGS

6.1 The warning signal will be either Numeral Pennant #2 or a Flag with the Santana Logo on it.

7. RACING AREA

7.1 The racing area will be to the North of the Okanagan Bridge.

8. COURSES

- 8.1 The diagram in Addendum A *Course Diagram* shows the course and the order in which marks are to be passed.
- 8.2 Legs of the course will not be changed after the preparatory signal. This changes RRS 33.

9. MARKS

- 9.1 Marks of the course will be orange tetrahedrons.
- 9.2 The starting line will be a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel and the course side of the starting mark.
- 9.3 The finishing line will be a staff displaying a blue flag on the race committee vessel and the course side of the finishing mark.

10. THE START

- 10.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat and a green mark.
- 10.2 The Start line is to be considered an obstruction and shall not be crossed unless a boat is starting or within her start sequence.
- 10.3 [NP] A boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.
- 10.4 To alert boats that a race will begin soon, a series of short sounds may be made one minute before a warning signal is made.

11. THE FINISH

11.1 The finish line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the committee boat and a red mark.

12. TIME LIMITS

12.1 The *Race Time Limit* and the *Finishing Window* are shown in the table below.

RACE TIME LIMIT	FINISHING WINDOW
90 Minutes	30 Minutes

12.3 Boats that do not finish within thirty (30) minutes after the first boat of the fleet sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish. This changes rules 35 and A4.

13. PROTESTS

- 13.1 Competitors are requested when finishing to inform the Committee Boat if they are intending to file a protest. Failure to do so will not affect the validity of a protest but is requested as a courtesy.
- 13.2 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the committee boat has docked at the conclusion of the day's racing. The time will be posted on the official notice board.
- 13.3 Protest forms are available at the race office.
- 13.4 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the members' lounge, beginning at the time posted.

14. SCORING

- 14.1 The Low Point scoring system of RRS Appendix A will be used.
- 14.2 One race is required to be completed to constitute a Regatta.
- 14.3 Scoring will be using actual time.
- 14.4 When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of their race scores.
- 14.5 When from five (5) to seven (7) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of their race scores excluding their worst score.
- 14.6 When eight (8) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of their race scores excluding their two (2) worst scores.
- 14.7 RRS A5.3 will apply.

15. SAFETY REGULATIONS

15.1 [DP] A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity.

16. TRASH

16.1 All competitors are reminded of RRS 47 and will ensure that trash is not discarded into the water.


17. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY


17.1 All those taking part in the racing do so at their own risk and responsibility. The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to during or after the regatta. Attention of the competitor is drawn to RRS Part 1, Fundamental Rule 3.

18. RISK STATEMENT

18.1 RRS 3 states "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone." By participating in this event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. The risks include, but are not limited to: strong winds, rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform, and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
