Dear Members,

I hope this message finds you and your family safe and healthy. As we uphold our commitment of open and transparent communication, there may be updates from time to time that run outside of our scheduled newsletters as we continue to monitor the daily recommendations surrounding the COVID-19 outbreak from our federal, provincial and municipal governments.

First and foremost, the safety of our members, community and colleagues remains paramount and our number one priority as a Club. We understand with the long weekend and sunny forecast ahead of us, the urge to be outside will be great. With this in mind, and in accordance with the recommendations of our provincial health authorities, the Board of Directors has put an additional measure in place, in the form of an interim regulation, to ensure we keep doing our part in flattening the curve. **Gatherings on any scale, of people who do not reside in the same household, are not permitted on the docks or any other Club premises.** To view the full Club Regulations, [please click here](#).

If you find yourself in the Club or basin facilities, we ask that you go directly to your vessel or destination, respect the space of fellow members, ensure the walkway is clear before proceeding, use a dock finger to step aside to give others appropriate space if needed and continuing to following all [government guidelines](#). If you are going out on the lake, only boat with those in your immediate household and avoid anchoring or rafting next to someone else. The [Downtown Marina](#) can sell fuel, however by appointment only. Please ensure all [required safety equipment](#) is on board and up to date. Most importantly, with all this in mind, let's make sure we are taking care of each other. Once again, we want to ensure the safety of our community, members and colleagues, and ask for your cooperation in doing so.

Several inquiries have been made regarding the scheduled date to expect the water to be turned on in the basin. This cannot be done until the risk of sub-zero overnight temperatures has lessened. We have had nights as low as -3 degrees this week, and the overnight forecast over the weekend showing below zero. We are currently using April 15<sup>th</sup> as our target and will communicate to our mooring members directly once that has been confirmed.

I would like to thank you for your continued support of the Club, and although this is a challenging time, the efforts we make now to do our part will be worth it in the long run in getting us back to enjoying our amazing asset sooner rather than later.
